

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED

- ❖ No student will be allowed to attend without a completed registration form signed by a parent or guardian.
- ❖ On-line registration will open Feb 5, 2020.
- ❖ Registration deadline is Mar. 1, 2020.
- ❖ Space is limited so register early.
- ❖ The maximum number of students from each school district or group is limited to 18. If registration exceeds that number, you will be placed on a waiting list.
- ❖ Adults may not accompany students to workshops.
- ❖ We offer a separate program for adults.
- ❖ All workshops are conducted in English.

WHAT WILL WE DO?

The conference is designed to introduce young women to STEM careers. STEM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics.

- ❖ Discover how interesting and fun science, math, engineering and technology can be.
- ❖ Learn about STEM career opportunities for women.
- ❖ Form personal contacts with women working in traditionally male occupations.
- ❖ Meet other young women interested in STEM courses and careers.

The conference will start with registration and breakfast followed by two workshop sessions with a brief break in between. After a presentation of high school science fair projects and the wrap-up session, lunch will be served.

Throughout the day we will play a “Mystery Woman in STEM” game. Girls will be challenged to meet women with interesting careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics and match them to clues provided.

WORKSHOPS FOR ADULTS

We have a selection of original workshops which include a chance to meet and talk with our Mystery Women, keeping your PC information safe, and Financial Aid for College.

Adult registration includes breakfast, workshops, lunch and a tour of the college. Adults must complete the registration forms and pay a \$15 fee.
