CURRENT ISSUES: PROUD AND POWERFUL AAUW -by Selena Barron

Recently AAUW national sent all members a collection of note cards highlighted by illustrations created by talented AAUW members across the country. The package is also a fundraising endeavor and a proud and powerful document describing the way AAUW makes "a tangible difference in women's lives through transformative efforts". The information reinforces our reasons for being members of the Westchester branch of AAUW. If you have not renewed your membership, please do so now in order that we can continue our support of our national and local efforts. Part of our branch dues does go to national AAUW. Below is a summary of the AAUW information.

AAUW'S "Every Voice, Every Vote Project" is commemorating the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment and the 55th anniversary of the Voting Rights Act. -- two critical milestones in ensuring women's right to vote. Your membership helps AAUW keep fighting voter suppression and racial discrimination so that every voice is heard and every vote is counted.

Within a year of launching the innovative Work Smart and Work Smart Online programs, which teach women to negotiate for fair wages and career advancement, more than 102,000 people registered for the training. AAUW recently received a second grant from the Coca Cola Foundation to expand the program.

In 2019 eleven states passed some form of fair-pay legislation, more than double last year's number.

During the 2019-2020 academic year, AAUW was one of the largest sources of funding for graduate women in the country. AAUW provided \$4.3 million in grants and fellowships to 270 outstanding women and nonprofit organizations.

AAUW's 2019 National Conference for College Women Student Leaders was the fourth largest in its 34 year history. More than 800 young women attended to learn from top women leaders and be inspired to follow their dreams.

An AAUW research program report found that workplace sexual harassment can negatively effect women's physical and mental health, limit their job choices, reduce prospects for career deveopment and even force them out of the workforce. Research results are used to inform national conversations and affect policy changes.

Although AAUW is nonpartisan, it does strongly advocate for policies that improve lives for girls, women and their families including investing in STEM education, reducing the burden of student debt carried by women, passing the Paycheck Fairness Act and implementing paid family and sick leave.
