Led by Leigh Hallingby, an excellent New York City tour guide, we saw beautiful murals painted on buildings in Harlem, depicting environmentally endangered birds, as well as large street sculptures of some of the birds. Below are pictures that were viewed on this tour.

Audubon Mural Project

A collaboration between the National Audubon Society and local artists to create murals of climate-threatened birds throughout John James Audubon's old Harlem neighborhood in New York City. This enormous mural can be found on Amsterdam Avenue between 153rd and 155th Streets. The project commissions artists to paint all 314 bird species identified in the Audubon Society's Birds and Climate change report: http://www.audubon.org/amp. So far, approximately half of the murals have been completed.

Going Zero Waste in Municipalities, Schools and Houses of Worship

Over the last 10 years Michelle has been instrumental in launching sustainability initiatives throughout Scarsdale and Westchester County. She has helped all seven Scarsdale Schools, a number of Scarsdale Houses of Worship and Scarsdale Village launch food scrap recycling and zero waste programs. Dear Westchester Branch AAUW Members,

As you are aware, AAUW National is increasing our dues with a schedule increase over the next 3 years.

Fortunately, NYS AAUW decided that because the COVID pandemic has shutdown many of their activities (cancellation of both State Conference for 2020 & 2021, reduced travel, etc.), they had enough State funds in reserve, that they could waive this year's NYS State Dues and let each Branch determine how they were going to utilize this \$13/member savings.

According to Westchester AAUW By-laws: "Annual AAUW dues and Member benefits for any category of Member shall be set by the AAUW Board of Directors. Members shall be notified of the intent to consider a change in the dues, the proposed amount, and the rationale for the change at least sixty days prior to the vote".

Your Board of Directors have had many thoughtful and challenging conversations regarding this opportunity. First, it needs to be pointed out for the last few years, our Branch has been running a deficit. Although we did not lose money last year because many projects were cancelled, most of our activities will proceed this year, despite COVID. We are projected to operate at a deficit, as we have done for a few past years.

Fortunately, the NYS AAUW Dues Waiver has come into the mix. The Westchester AAUW Board of Directors decided that for this year only, if we applied the \$13 Waiver to our Branch's treasury, our Branch financial situation would improve. The dues for the next three years will be:

2021-2022 \$98

2022-2023 \$103

2023-2014 \$108

In April the Membership will vote on the 2021-2022 Budget, and the incoming Board of Directors and the acceptance of the dues change for 2021-2022. This letter (which was emailed to members in early February) serves as the sixty days' notice of our dues structure and next year's budget.

Bev Neufeld, President of PowHerNY said, "Advocates across New York call on lawmakers to take affirmative steps to pass laws to create an equitable recovery and future for women, especially women of color. That means addressing racism head on and honoring the inordinate sacrifices of essential workers, the challenges of caregivers, and crushing loss of the unemployed. PowHer New York's 2021 priorities and Roadmap do just that."
