Westchester Community College's changes in their scholarship programs Marilee Scheuneman (as guest):

A: WCC scholarship checks will no longer be sent by members directly to WCC. They will be collected by AAUW Westchester and sent as a lump sum to WCC.

- B: WCC has merged their financial aid and scholarships; they want scholarships to support current students (not graduates).
- C: WCC wants donations of \$5,000.00 annually to support 2 students. That amount is more than we can give on a regular basis so we need to discuss this next year.
- D. we will donate quarterly and remember to take care of students who need help even at the end of their studies at WCC.
- E. The lunch cost is \$12 for luncheon we organize as a fund raiser. We can charge \$35.00 in order to have funds for the scholarship. The Membership will be informed of our \$5,000.00 goal. We will try to raise the money this year. We will reconsider if we fail.
- F. Although WCC gave \$1,000.00 per student a few years ago, WCC now clearly has interest in big donors.
- G. Marilee reminded us to consistently remember to thank donors.

Communications: Constant Contact is an online subscription service for communications and newsletters, available for \$10.00 per month.

AAUW Westchester will purchase an account to enable several designated individuals to send messages out to the membership. These will be Co-Presidents, Co-VPs for membership, and Sue Lambert (Chips Editor).

2d. Programs: Lorrin informed us that Diona Koerner would be happy to see us making up last year's bad weather and take us around the zoo on a Wednesday in May.

Lorrin told us that we don't have our set date for the STEM Conference at the College of Mount St. Vincent. The program is for 7thgrade girls.
